2. What title would you give each of the following section - vv.1-6, vv.7-13 and vv.14-25?

MEANING - What does it mean?

- 3. What is the point of Paul's illustration from marriage in vv.1-6? How have we been released from the law?
- 4. The question in verse 7 "Is the law sin?" seems unexpected. Why do you think Paul raises it here? Summarise Paul's answer.
- 5. In verses 14-25 Paul explains his experience of moving from slavery to sin to slavery to God. It's a difficult everyday battle to be who you are in Jesus. Put Paul's experience in your own words.
- 6. How do verses 24 and 25 help us fight the everyday battle as Christians?

APPLICATION – How does it change us?

- 7. How is Romans 7 a comfort to us as we struggle to live the Christian life each day?
- 8. A young Christian shares this with you. How would you respond:

"I thought I was a Christian but last weekend I went out with some friends and slipped into my old ways. Someone told me that my faith doesn't look very real to them. I don't know what to think now"

9. What are some tips you'd give for fighting the everyday battle of living for Jesus in this world?
