

STUDY 1: Our Father in heaven (Matthew 6:5-13, 7:7-11)

If you stopped someone on the street and asked them what they think of "prayer" what do you think they'd say? How would you define prayer?

CONTEXT – Where does it fit?

- 1. Have a brief scan Matthew chapter 5-7. What is the context in which Jesus teaches his disciples about prayer in Matthew 6 and 7?
- 2. Read Matthew 6:5-15. What is the immediate context for the Lord's prayer from Matthew 6:5-8?

OBSERVATION – How is it communicated?

3. Re-read Matthew 6:9-13. How would you break it up into sections? What title would you give each section?

MEANING - What does it mean?

- 4. When you read "Our Father in heaven" what stands out to you? What is the significance of "our" rather than "my"?
- 5. Read Galatians 4:4-7. How would you explain the process of coming to have God as your Father from this passage? What does "adoption to sonship" mean?
- 6. Read Matthew 7:7-11. What does this tell us about God as our Father?

APPLICATION – How does it change us?

- 7. How does knowing that God is your Father make you feel?
- 8. If God our Father longs to give us good gifts, how should that shape the way we pray?
- 9. If God our Father is dependable and loves us no matter what, how should that shape the way we pray?

Spend some times praying like that – to God our Father.
